Rambling Rich

Waipuna Hospice is a member of the Te Manawa Taki region and to assist with planning and equitable service provision across this diverse and large region, we are joining our sister hospices in the region in an alliance.

Many of you will have heard about the constant pressure and change that is taking place within our healthcare system from the media. The pressure to deliver equitable healthcare services against a backdrop of change and reduced staffing numbers is very real across the whole health sector and Waipuna Hospice is no exception to this situation.

The high cost of living and the impact this has on our ability to fundraise and raise income from our retail shops is adding additional pressure to our financial sustainability. Waipuna Hospice, through the highly appreciated support of our local community, co-funds over half of our services from this income. This is a staggering fact and specialist hospice palliative care does not appear to be a priority for Health NZ/Te Whatu Ora or successive government administrations. This is despite repeated commitments from governments that Hospice funding nationally would be maintained at 70%.

Costs are increasing and wage cost pressure is higher than ever. We work in a very competitive employment market and must maintain parity with the benchmark salary rates across all the industries we work in (health, retail and fundraising). This is looking to be increasingly difficult.

I know that many of you will be worried about this situation and will again show your fantastic support for us through donations of money, goods for our shops



or time whilst volunteering – thank you for this. It is greatly appreciated and we would not have such a comprehensive service in Western Bay of Plenty without your support!

It is time as a nation to have a wider conversation – do we value the care we receive at the end of someone's life? Does this care benefit society when it is available and provided across NZ in an equitable and compassionate way? Is it time for Health NZ to listen to providers of end-of-life care and prioritise it as a separate pillar for care provision – we have "Living Well", why not "Dying Well"?

Most importantly – do we value the care provided enough to fund it so it is sustainable into the future?

This is an important question that will be the focus of my discussions with my healthcare colleagues.

As always, thank you for reading this newsletter – you will see the impact we have on our community through what we do and find opportunities to support us through many different ways.

Passionate for Palliative Care

Our Superhero Walk, where people in our community pledged to raise funds for Waipuna Hospice and honour those they love, recently wrapped up for 2024. Bee McKinnon, a nurse in our Inpatient Unit, took part and raised \$592 to support our work! We spoke to her about her personal experience with hospice services, which led her to take part and fundraise.

Before Bee began working for Waipuna Hospice, both her mother and her best friend, Stena, went through hospice care. In 2008, Bee's mother passed away from adrenal cancer at the age of 65. Reflecting on her Mum's experience, Bee recalled the exceptional care provided by the hospice team. "Hospice was great with Mum and she received excellent care. The day she died was a beautiful sunny day, and she slipped away so gently and peacefully. Sixteen years later we still take so much comfort from the manner in which her last days unfolded."

Seeing both her mum and best friend go through hospice is what led her to a career in palliative care. "I was doing general medical nursing at the time, but wondered if there was something worth exploring in palliative care. I didn't go straight into it, but I always had it in the back of my mind that I would love to be a hospice nurse. I wasn't sure I could do it though, if I'm honest. But one day I just thought, what the heck, I'll try it - and I love it!"

Now having worked here for eight years, Bee has carried her personal experiences into caring for hospice patients. "The thing I always remember from our experience with Mum, is that those last moments are what stay with you in the years to come. There is so much peace of mind and comfort for the road ahead, when your last memories are that your loved one was settled and pain free. In our work at Waipuna Hospice, we do all we can for our patients so that they are able to end their days comfortably and peacefully."

Participating in the Superhero Walk brought Bee full circle – from having loved ones go through the service, to becoming a hospice nurse, and now being a supporter of the work she does.

Going this extra mile shows how much she values hospice care. "We really believe in the work that we do. Every day we hope to be able to make a difference."

Being able to walk in honour of her mum and best friend and experience the support of the community was such a positive experience for Bee. "I felt like Mum and Stena would have been pleased and proud. It's nice to do something that is in their memory. In a way it keeps them alive."

We want to thank Bee for sharing her story, and for going above and beyond to support Waipuna Hospice.


Cultivating Compassion: A Collective Effort of Serenity

Nestled along the banks of the tranquil Wairoa River, Waipuna Hospice is a sanctuary amidst lush surroundings. It offers solace to hospice patients and their loved ones during life's most difficult times. Many who visit our grounds comment upon its calming beauty, a testament to the respite it provides amid adversity.

Maintaining the 2.13 hectares of this sanctuary demands considerable investment and hard work. Yet, through the compassion and generosity of local businesses and volunteers, our gardens continue to be a place of peace for all who visit us in Te Puna.

John, of Athenree Advanced Mulching, found solace in our gardens while supporting his wife, Michelle, in our Inpatient Unit. Reflecting on its peacefulness, he shared, "It was merely a step away from the entrance, yet it felt like a world apart from worries and

troubles, even if just for a few moments." When he saw it was closed due to ground conditions, John felt repairing it was something small he could do for Waipuna Hospice to repay the respect, care, hospitality and compassion bestowed upon them by the staff at Waipuna Hospice over their journey.

With years of experience in farming, John approached the task with expertise and care, mindful of preserving the land. "My background taught me the importance of proper land management," he explained, "ensuring water flows naturally and doesn't pond." Collaborating with Beach Contracting, who generously provided transport, and McFall Fuel, who donated essential resources, the affected land was revitalised - a testament to the power of collective goodwill.

Though the undertaking demanded time and effort, John remained constant in his commitment to excellence. "Every effort was worth it. If it was four days of running up and down about 100 square meters or something else, it was going to be done right. I wanted to be able to drive past and say that I'm proud of it. It was more than a job, it was something that I could give back to the place that had done so much for me and Michelle," he remarked.

The collective generosity of these local businesses has left a permanent mark, reinstating our gardens as a sanctuary for patients and their families.
